

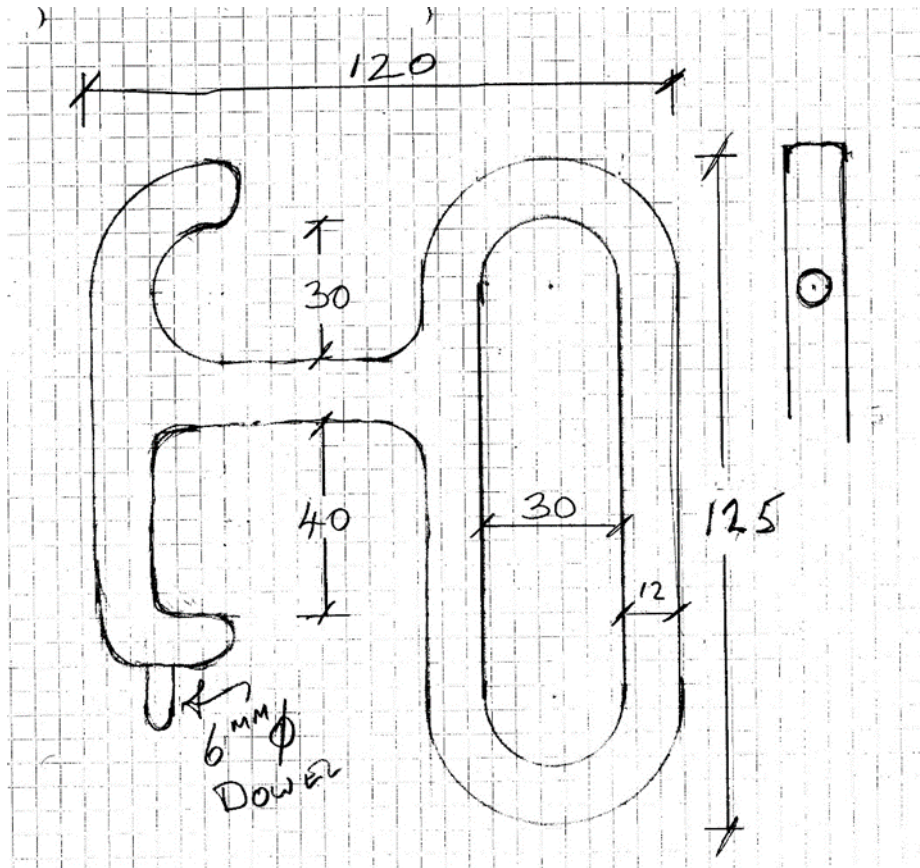
What is it by Ian Elliott

We have been totally isolating since our last demonstration back in March. The only time we have been out of the house was to go to the Doctors or to be tested for the virus (came back negative for both of us). We have had our shopping done for us each week, plus some online deliveries. Even though the lock down has been eased our intention is to continue to isolate, but we must go to the Freeman Hospital next week.

To mitigate contact with hard surfaces I have come up with this device. The concept is not mine, but the design is. I saw a one on the local news some time ago, but it was cast metal more like a small push stick. Mine is made from 12mm Birch plywood.

All the photographs below were taken in our home, to give you a general idea of uses, but the intended use is for public places. Other uses not shown could be lift buttons, car park barriers, ATM's, card readers at checkouts etc. I have put some basic sizes on my plan in case anyone is interested, mine is Birch plywood because that what I had.







This device is only intended as a tool not a substitute for keeping 2 metres apart or washing you hands regularly.
